## Volunteer to Help Young Learners Read


CUMC is offering our support to the students of Hoffman Boston Elementary School. Education research confirms that children who read below grade level in the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> grade have a very hard time ever catching up. We want to help them before they fall too far behind.



The minimum commitment is one day per week for at least one semester. Sessions run from 4:00 till 4:45 PM Monday through Thursday for simply reading with a student one on one and chatting about the book(s) and anything else the child wants to discuss!. There's a formal process for approving volunteers and a short online training class on Safe Schools. The School Reading Specialists provide books and coordinate the schedule for each volunteer.
