INTRODUCTION TO THE SERVICE

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Brothers and sisters in Christ:

PRESENTATION OF CANDIDATE FOR CONFIRMATION

RENUNCIATION OF SIN AND PROFESSION OF FAITH

The pastor addresses Confirmand:

Will you nurture one another in the Christian faith and life and include James who is now before you in your care?

With God's help we will proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ.

We will surround James

with a community of love and forgiveness, that he may grow in his trust of God, and be found faithful in his service to others.

We will pray for him,

that he may be a true disciple who walks in the way that leads to life.

The pastor addresses all, and the congregation joins the candidate and his parents and sponsor in responding:

Let us join together in professing the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
