Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson Bishop, Virginia Annual Conference

Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson was elected bishop by the 2016 Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference (SEJ) of The United Methodist Church and consecrated July 15, 2016. Her first assignment as bishop was to the North Georgia Episcopal Area beginning September 1, 2016. She was assigned to the Virginia Conference at the 2022 SEJ Conference.

A Florida native, Bishop Haupert-Johnson (or "Bishop Sue") is a graduate of the University of Florida (B.S. in Business Administration), University of Florida College of Law (J.D.), and Candler School of Theology at Emory University (M.Div.). She was a federal law clerk and a litigator with the Tampa law firm of Carlton, Fields before she answered her call to ministry.

Bishop Haupert-Johnson is known for mission-driven and fruitful appointment making and her work on alignment of focus at the annual conference level. She serves on the Board of Directors for Global Ministries. She serves on the Emory University Board of Trustees as well as five other United Methodist-related colleges and universities in Virginia, and on numerous ministry and agency boards. She chairs the Dean's Advisory Council of The Candler School of Theology and serves on the Board of Governors at Wesley Theological Seminary.

Bishop Haupert-Johnson is married to Rev. Allen Johnson. They have a daughter, Samantha. She enjoys NCAA football and basketball, all things Broadway, reading and movies.

Rev. Dr. Sarah Calvert serves as the District Superintendent for all churches in the Northern Virginia District. (All churches from the previous Arlington and Alexandria districts are now part of the Northern Virginia District.)

Sarah grew up all over as a military kid (itinerant from an early age!), ending up in Fairfax, Va., graduating from Oakton High School. She has a BA in Economics from Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg and then became an attorney with her own firm in Fairfax after receiving her law degree from George Mason Law School. After an overwhelming and literal calling from God, Sarah attended Wesley Theological Seminary receiving her Masters of Divinity there and then again a few years later went back for her Doctorate in Church Leadership. Her dissertation work was on clergy peer groups.

Sarah served as associate pastor for 6 years at a large church in Loudoun, planting an offsite for them and developing outreach into the community. She then spent 3 years as a sole pastor, helping revitalize a small church in Luray, Va. She served as the Bi-District (Alexandria and Arlington) Coordinator for Church Revitalization and Leadership Development before she became the Arlington and, now, NOVA District Superintendent.
