Introduction to the Service

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Siblings in Christ:

Through the Sacrament of Baptism

We are incorporated into God's mighty acts of salvation and given new birth through water and the Spirit.

and through the reaffirmation of our faith,

Presentation of Candidates

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

The pastor addresses the confirmand and the persons coming into membership and their sponsors:

On behalf of the whole Church, I ask you:

Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness,

reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin?

I do.

Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?

The pastor addresses the sponsors:

Will you who sponsor these candidates support and encourage them in their Christian life?

I will.

The pastor addresses the congregation, and the congregation responds:

Do you, as Christ's body, the Church, reaffirm both your rejection of sin and your commitment to Christ?

We do.

Will you nurture one another in the Christian faith and life and include these persons who are now before you in your care?

With God's help we will proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ.

We will surround these persons

with a community of love and forgiveness, that they may grow in their trust of God, and be found faithful in their service to others.

We will pray for them,

that they may be true disciples who walk in the way that leads to life.
